Partnership definitions

United Nations General Assembly and ECOSOC

Voluntary initiatives undertaken by Governments and relevant stakeholders, which efforts are contributing to the implementation of inter-governmentally agreed development goals

Voluntary and collaborative relationships between various parties, both public and non-public, in which all participants agree to work together to achieve a common purpose or undertake a specific task and, as mutually agreed, to share risks and responsibilities, resources and benefits

Be consistent with national laws and national development strategies and plans, as well as the priorities of countries where they are implemented, bearing in mind the relevant guidance provided by Governments




17 PARTINERSHIPS FOR THE GOALS

Partnership **Platforms**

Mechanism to systematically drive the creation multi-stakeholder partnerships for development.

Convene and align government, business, NGOs, donors and other development actors around a particular SDG

Facilitate innovative collaborative approaches and directly broker and support new partnership action.

Enabling environment

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
Advocates, nationally and globally, for a common agenda across societal sectors, as well as strengthening the enabling environment for collaboration

Coordinated commitment to action

Enables stakeholders to commit to a common plan, which they hold themselves and each other responsible for delivering.

SDG-aligned investments

Align aid, foreign direct investment, philanthropy, domestic financing and other forms of capital in ways that contribute to the SDGs



Launched in 2017 - Government of Kenya and UN System in Kenya

Purpose: Accelerating SDGs in Kenya by enhancing multi-stakeholder and cross-sectoral partnerships. Unlock private, philanthropic and intellectual capital for the Government's priority SDG agenda.

Involved partners: Government, UN, development partners, private sector, civil society, philanthropy, academia, and faith-based organizations

Contributing to Kenya's Big Four: Universal Health Coverage (SGD3), Food and Nutrition Security, Manufacturing and Skills Training, and Affordable Housing.

Raised: 5,8 million USD (multi-lateral, bilateral, philanthropic and private sector partners) (*as of May 2019*)

Launched February 2020, by Government of Samoa and UN system in Samoa

Purpose: to ensure all children have access to vaccination through timely and safe routine immunization to avoid outbreaks and further enjoy a healthy life.

Responding to need: In Dec 2019, Gov launched the National Measles Response and Recovery Appeal

Target: To raise 10,7 million USD

WHAT CAN **GOVERNMENTS** DO TO FOSTER EFFECTIVE PARTNERSHIPS FOR THE SDGS

National enabling policy environment supportive of collaboration

Work with UN and partners to establish platforms to systematically catalyze actions and partnerships

> Develop partnerships built to good practice standards

Build capacity of stakeholders on partnership effectiveness, building a culture of collaboration and wholeof-society approach

Create safe space for dialogue and trusted relationships across stakeholders

- Partnership between the Ministry of the Environment and Renewable Energies, GIZ, and the national park of El Kala, for promoting biodiversity and developing of organic products, working closely with rural women and other stakeholders
- 2. Women for Growth Partnership, through UNIDO, UNPD, ILO, for promoting women entrepreneurs
- 3. Partnerships with UNDP for developing guidelines for teachers and facilitators in environmental education




- 1. Developed Strategic Partnership Framework (SPF) in partnership with the Office of the UN Resident Coordinator in Bahrain
- 2. Partnership with UNIDO and Bahrain led to the establishment of the Arab International Centre for Entrepreneurship and Investment, aimed a strengthening indigenous capacities of selected countries in the Arab, Asian and region for promoting domestic investments and facilitating foreign direct investments

BAHRAIN



- 1. Ministry of Manpower and Immigration and American University in Cairo developed partnership aimed to enhance the participation of young, unemployed women with medium and higher education in the economy and to improve their security and rights.
- 2. The Asmarat Housing Project, a partnership between the Government, Al-Orman Society, and the Tahya Misr fund to provide safe and affordable housing
- 3. Partnership between Nile Egyptian Schools and international Cambridge Assessment agency. aim at providing internationally renowned education

 Partnership with the World Bank in the formulation of a strategic roadmap for social protection








- First Arab country to join the Open Government Partnership – ensuring citizen participation has as a role in shaping and overseeing governments
- Joined the Partnership for Market Readiness (PMR) - forum for collective innovation and action and a fund to support capacity building to scale up climate change mitigation

JORDAN



- Partnership with UNDP and Women's Research and Studies Centre at Kuwait University aimed at supporting SDG 5
- 2. Government working closely with CSO to collect data on human trafficking and to ensure the safe return of trafficked victims to their countries of origin.

KUWAIT



- 1. Global Compact Local Chapter established at the American University of Beirut (AUB), promoting learning and responsible business practices
- 2. Adoption of a PPP law 2017 by Parliament allow more transparent and effective partnership modalities.

LEBANON

 Reform of the Investment Code and the adoption of the legal and institutional framework of Public-Private Partnerships have started to yield results with new public-private partnerships in aviation sector.
