Mr. Özgür Pehlivan is Counsellor for Economic Affairs and Deputy Permanent Representative at the Permanent Mission of Turkey to the United Nations in New York. He has been representing Turkey in the Fifth Committee of the United Nations General Assembly since the 66th session of the General Assembly and his responsibilities also cover administrative and budgetary aspects of various United Nations funds and programs. For almost twenty years, Mr. Pehlivan worked for the Undersecretariat of Treasury in Turkey where he served as Head of the Bilateral Financing and of the World Bank Projects Departments and then as Deputy Director General in charge of public projects financing and relations with the international financial institutions.
