Zou Ji (China)

Mr. Zou Ji is Deputy Director General of the National Center for Climate Change Strategy and International Cooperation (NCSC) under the National Development and Reform Commission in China. Mr. Zou has worked in areas such as economic analysis of energy and climate policies, with a focus on technology changes and international climate architecture, and sustainable urban planning. He was nominated as a delegate of China for the UN Climate Talks during the 2000 - 2009 period and from 2012 to now on. He was a lead author of Working Group III for the Fourth Assessment Report of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), and a coordinating lead author of Working Group III for the Fifth Assessment Report. He was also a member of the Expert Group of Technology Transfer (EGTT) under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). He worked as a consultant for the World Bank, the Asian Development Bank, the United Nations Development Program and other international organizations, and served as China Country Director for the World Resources Institute (WRI). Mr. Zou holds a Ph.D. in environmental and resources economics from the Renmin University of China, a Masters degree in Engineering Economics from Tsinghua University and a Bachelor's degree in environmental engineering. He has been a visiting scholar at the London School of Economics and Political Sciences, at Resources for the Future and at the John F. Kennedy School of Government (Harvard University).
