## Objective of the event

- Discuss new models of stakeholder engagement for the Sustainable Development Goals, the High Level Political Forum and the Intergovernmental Committee on a Sustainable Development Financing Strategy
- Develop joint advocacy strategies for the post-Rio+20 and post-MDG processes
- Facilitate dialogue between Major Groups and other stakeholders, UN bodies and Government representatives
