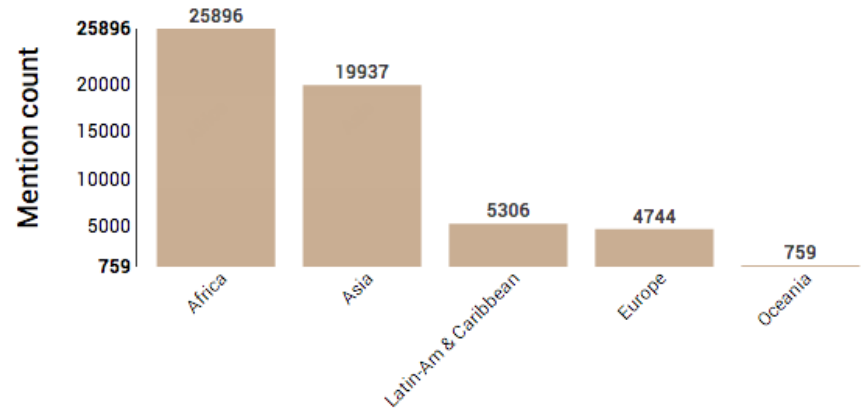

An Organization can identify themselves as Being a member of a particular Major Group.

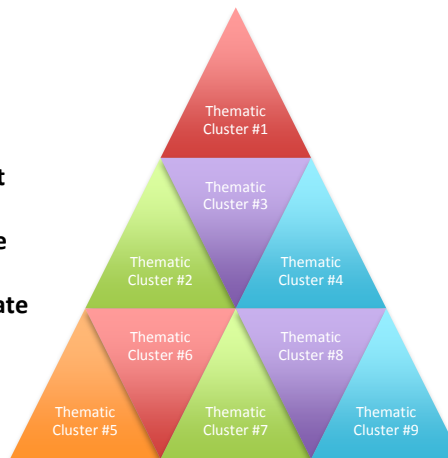
Example: Civicus can connect its own profile to The NGO Major Group space, signifying their membership.
