The purpose of the <i>Act</i> is to provide the legal framework for developing and implementing a Federal Sustainable Development Strategy (FSDS) that will make environmental decision-making more transparent and accountable to Parliament. Specifically, it requires: The development, and tabling in Parliament, of a FSDS by June 26, 2010, to be updated every three years; The development, and tabling in Parliament, of complementary
	Sustainable Development Strategies for selected federal departments and agencies within one year of the FSDS, to be updated every three years; A Cabinet Committee to provide oversight of the development and implementation of the FSDS;
	 The establishment of a Sustainable Development Office within Environment Canada; The appointment of a multi-stakeholder Sustainable Development
