Mauritius +5

GA Resolution 63/213

The General Assembly requested the SG:

- 1. To report on the:
 - a. Follow-up to; and
 - b. Implementation of the Mauritius Strategy of Implementation (MSI);
 - with focus on vulnerabilities of SIDS.
- 2. To report on possible arrangements for a high-level review of MSI at the 65th session of GA.

Vulnerabilities of SIDS:

- > Structural problems
- > Physical challenges
- > Institutional limitations
- > Adverse effects of Climate Change

Action taken

Mauritius +5

Structural Problems:

- Small and isolated markets;
- Narrow resource base;
- Limited local capital for investments;
- Dependency on primary product exports;
- Heavy reliance on imports;
- Vulnerable to outside economic and financial shocks, etc..

Action taken

Mauritius +5

Physical challenges:

- Remoteness;
- Geographic dispersion;
- Fragile ecosystems;
- Limited freshwater supplies;
- Communication and transport constraints, etc.

Follow-up

Action taken

Mauritius +5

Institutional Limitations:

- Weak institutional capacity for strategic D-M;
- Limited skilled human resources;
- Lack of information, data collection and analysis ability;
- Weak or non-existent process of formulating/implementing integrative NSDS or its equivalent, etc.

Mauritius +5

Adverse effects of Climate Change:

- Prone to disruption by natural disasters affecting social, economic well-being;
- Sea-level rise threatening island survival;
- Ocean warming/increased acidification;
- Coral breaching that affects tourisms, etc.

 Mainstream climate change adaptation in development strategies >Building resilience
 - Need for an integrated policy response & sustainable management in agriculture >Enhancing food security
 - Management and control of invasive species>protect biodiversity
 - Need for agro-diversification in the rural sector>enhance value-added activities

- CSD-18 to act as a prep com;
- Address vulnerabilities of SIDS.


