

KUCHING: Women should consider learning martial art to better protect themselves against petty crime.

In suggesting this, Assistant Minister for Public Health Dr Jerip Suali told the crowd at the opening of Kuching Festival Cash Martial Arts Display 2012 at the State Hockey Stadium here on Saturday night that martial arts were a good form of self-defence.

"Martial arts can play a role in protecting us from becoming the victims of petty crime such as the snatch crime which is mainly targeting women. It would be good if we can learn a self-defence skill," said the Bengoh assemblyman.

He pointed out that by learning a martial art, it would also push the practitioners to exercise regularly.

Regular exercise, he said, was vital for reducing the risk of having non-communicable diseases such as high pressure, diabetes and heart diseases.

"Martial arts also play a role in inculcating a healthy culture among the people. This is in line with the objective of Ministry of Local Government and Community Development to create the healthy community," he said.

Martial arts are also a good medium for people from different backgrounds and races to interact, Dr Jerip said, adding, "To me, martial arts are also an art form for personal development as they require good discipline. Such discipline will help build a person's determination towards to success. A successful person always has good discipline."

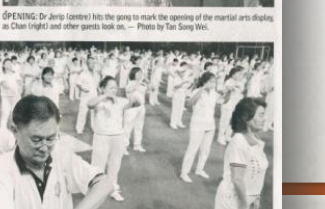

## Harmony, bonding - pillars of a socially cohesive city: Mayor

**KUCHING:** Community harmony and bonding are important pillars in ensuring that Kuching remains a socially cohesive city, said Mayor James Chan.

"As a small city, these are vital factors for Kuching to continue to be successful at the economic front.

"The key to social cohesion is continuous interaction among the various groups which in turn will lead to bonding and emergence of social networks.

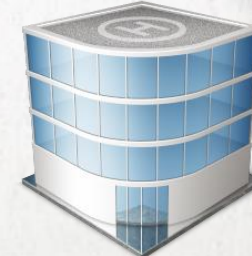

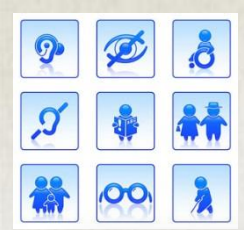
