Q1:What should be measured

- (1) Progress of SDGs in both global and national levels, synergies and interactions among population, energy, water, food, land and poverty
- (2) Status of balance and coordination among global economy, society and environment;
- (3) Gaps of development between regions and countries, in particular between developed and developing nations;
- (4) Good experiences and lessons learned, from global, sub-regional, national, municipal, communities

Q2: How to measure?

- 1. Global SD expert working group, Establish an efficient operating inter-government mechanism so that the progress can be measured regularly, e.g. once every four years.
- 2. National SD Communication, the all member states should be involved, and a standardized reporting national sustainable development information should be established. Member states should provide the GSDR working group with related data, materials and typical cases on a regular basis.
