STATEMENT TO HLPF 30 JUNE 2014

Mr. President, Excellencies, Ladies and Gentlemen:

My name is James Collins. I am a UN representative to the UN of the International Council on Social Welfare.

In attending the 12 sessions of the Open Working Group on SDGs and this panel today, I have been struck by the ambiguity in the use of the term "universal" in relation to the post-2015 agenda. Some, like the Moderator today, apply the term to Member-States: that the agenda applies to all 193 of them; others apply it to peoples: that the agenda covers all people of all ages and abilities. I believe both uses are correct.

I request, therefore, that this dual nature of the term "universal" be recognized and made explicit in the outcome documents of this 2^{nd} session of the HLPF and of the Open Working Group on SDGs.

Only if the post-2015 agenda applies universally to all Member-States and to all people of all ages and abilities can the long-term goal stated by Ambassador Körösi of improving the quality of life for all be achieved.
