Concept note and tentative programme

INTRODUCTION

The High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF), the United Nations' central platform for follow-up and review of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, including the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), will be convened on 10-19 July 2017, under the theme: "*Eradicating poverty and promoting prosperity in a changing world*". The session will review, in depth, the following SDGs:

Means of implementation, including with respect to Goal 17, will also be reviewed in the session.

Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs) are an integral aspect of the High-level Political Forum and follow-up and review of the 2030 Agenda and SDGs. They provide a broad platform for partnerships, enabling the participation of major groups and other relevant stakeholders and the exchange of experiences—including successes, challenges, and lessons learned, with the objective of accelerating implementation of the 2030 Agenda.

In support of the work of the High-level Political Forum and the Voluntary National Reviews, the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN-DESA), in collaboration with the United Nations Office for Partnerships (UNOP), is organizing for the second time a *Partnership Exchange special event*, to enhance the global partnership for sustainable development. The event, organized on the occasion of the 2017 HLPF, will be open to all HLPF participants, with a special focus on reviewing the work of multi-stakeholder partnerships and other voluntary initiatives in driving implementation of Sustainable Development Goals 1, 2, 3, 5, 9, 14 and 17.

Relevance for 2017 Partnership Exchange

- Thematic focus addressing one or more of the SDGs under in-depth review at the 2017 High-level Political Forum
- Lessons learned are there any lessons learned that are relevant for other initiatives?

Effectiveness and long-term transformative impact

- Is the initiative/partnership adding concrete value to the implementation of the SDGs? If so, how?
- Does the initiative/partnership transfer technology or build capacities in developing countries? (where relevant)
- How well-established and recognized is the initiative/partnership? (e.g. years in operation, references in the press/academic papers)
- Is the initiative/partnership based on predictable and sustained resources for its implementation?
- Does the initiative/partnership have a potential for significant impact, and can it be scaled?

Approach and internal governance

- <u>Mission</u> Does the initiative/partnership have specific and clearly defined, measurable, achievable and accepted, relevant and realistic, and time-bound objectives?
- <u>Integration</u> is the initiative/partnership bearing in mind the economic, social, and environmental dimensions of sustainable development in its design and implementation?
- <u>Local ownership and inclusiveness</u> does the initiative/partnership involve local governments and other relevant stakeholders during the planning and implementation process? If relevant, does it have sectoral and geographic balance? Does it also aim to support the most vulnerable and marginal communities?
- <u>Governance structure</u> does the initiative/partnership apply a transparent, accountable, efficient, participatory, qualitative and equitable multi-stakeholder approach?
- <u>Transparency and accountability</u> is the initiative/partnership designed and implemented in a transparent and accountable manner? Are there robust and transparent monitoring mechanisms and performance measures to ensure accountability? Is the initiative/partnership registered in an open registry, such as the Partnership for SDGs online platform?

CONTRIBUTE TO THE ANNUAL REPORT - SUBMIT A PROGRESS REPORT

All stakeholders with registered multi-stakeholder partnerships and voluntary commitments in the **Partnerships for SDGs online platform** are encouraged to submit a short progress report of their initiatives through the online platform. These short progress reports will appear on the HLPF Inputs Database, and form the basis of an annual report by the Secretariat on how partnerships and other voluntary initiatives are driving the implementation of the SDGs.
