# IDP Financing Aligned to the SDGs in Jamaica, as of June 2018

Official Development Assistance in the form of loans, grants and technical assistance from multilateral and bilateral sources supports the Government of Jamaica's policies and strategies and are aligned to the country's overall development goals as articulated under the Vision 2030 Jamaica – National Development Plan.

The SDGs were adopted by the 193 Member States of the United Nations in September 2015 and came into force on January 1, 2016. This landmark agreement envisions the creation of a better world that is free of poverty and underpinned by universal peace, where 'no one is left behind'. The SDGs are therefore an agenda to advance—People, Planet, Prosperity, Peace and Partnership (5Ps). This is not dissimilar to the overarching vision of Jamaica and the goals and outcomes contained in the National Development Plan. In fact, Vision 2030 Jamaica served as a framework for the development of the country's National Outcome Document for SDGs.

It is well recognized globally that financing the implementation of the SDGs is a complex task and requires coordination among public and private sectors, and the international development partner community, as well as coordination with civil society organizations. Coupled with coordination, is meaningful commitment of all stakeholders to advance the 5Ps. Financing of the SDGs will undoubtedly be aided by Addis Ababa Agenda—a transformational financing agenda—which provides a global framework for financing sustainable development and is an integral part of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development as it recognized the importance of financing flows being aligned with economics, social and environmental priorities of countries.

Within this context, this document was prepared as a first attempt to assess the contribution of Jamaica's International Development Partners to the financing and implementation of the SDGs. The document itemizes current projects by sector and how these are contributing to the achievement of the SDGs.
