Context:

In collaboration with the Global Taskforce of Local and Regional Governments, the multi-stakeholder coalition Local2030 is bringing together experts from the public, private, and non-governmental sectors to work with local leaders and representatives from multiple United Nations agencies to present new local-level actions at the High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF).

Data, financing, capacity building in humanitarian and conflict settings, and climate action and clean energy will be at the centre of the different sessions.

The focus of this multi-stakeholder event is on developing and presenting new solutions to accelerate and scale local-level implementation of all Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and provide innovative concepts for the UN-wide strategy on SDG localization under development by Local2030. This event and new Local2030 commitments announced will build on the discussions at the Local and Regional Governments' Forum that is being held on 16 July.

This session will focus on the needs, challenges and opportunities for SDG capacity building in such contexts.
