Cross-sector partnerships as new paradoxical governance form

'Classical' PPPs	Cross-sector partnerships for sustainable development
For-profit - public	For profit – public (intern./national) – NGO - research
Up-front investment	Combined resources
Government sets the rules	Co-design
Transfer risk to private sector for delivery	Shared risk between parties
Contract-based with clear accountability	Co-accountability
Transactional relationship	Transformative relationship

- Contribution is properly valued (respect for added value)
- Clear roles, responsibilities and rights
- Basic rules of the game for the collaboration
- Capacity building measures for partnering through trainings, guidelines, and toolkits
- Joint ownership of the process and outcomes
- Facilitation & convening

- Build trust between partners to support day-to-day working relationship
- Taking time for clarity about individual objectives
- Clear and ongoing information flow (internal and external)
- Clarity in partner expectations with regard to relationship and benefits
- 'Small wins'



Inclusiveness



• Engage all partners in collaborative decision-making

- Engage as early as possible
- Distribute tasks according to expertise and capabilities
- Facilitate spaces for informal interaction and feedback
- Foster a culture of mutual adjustment


