


Republic of Croatia



- Croatia imports around 40% electricity,40% gas and 80% of oil.

Biodiversity

- 1,244 islands, islets, reefs and cliffs
- 2.75 million hectares of forests and forest land
- 47.7% of total land area
- One third of the territory part of the European network of nature protection areas (Natura 2000)

Preservation of national and cultural heritage

- 417 protected natural areas -comprising 8.6%
 of the national territory
- 8,000 protected cultural heritage sites –
 10 listed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites
 17 inscribed on the intensible cultural heritage
- 17 inscribed on the intangible cultural heritage list



- the institution of Ombudsperson:
- 1) Ombudswoman for the promotion and protection of human rights and freedoms
- 2) Ombudswoman for Children
- 3) Gender Equality Ombudswoman

- fight against corruption



CIVIL SOCIETY - key role of the "watchdog"

- Government of Croatia provided around 170 million dollars (from the European Social Fund)
- A particular emphasis on improving skills and knowledge of children and young people in sustainable development area – 36 specific projects will include 10,000 children by the end of 2020, as well as 185 training programmes


