

## Success Stories




Liechtenstein is «**Solar World Champion**» and the first «**Energy Country**» in the World

MODERN SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

- Put the financial sector at the heart of global efforts to end modern slavery and human trafficking
- Public-Private Partnership between Governments of Liechtenstein, Australia, Netherlands and private sector actors from Liechtenstein
- Accelerate engagement of the global financial sector to tackle these crimes
- The Commission consists of 25 members with diverse backgrounds
- Presentation of Blueprint during 73rd Session of UNGA
- Multi-stakeholder dissemination and implementation phase

## Key initiatives: «Waterfootprint Liechtenstein»




### Waterfootprint Liechtenstein

- Simple Principle: Drink tap water. Donate drinking water.
- One Waterfootprint means:
  - One person in Liechtenstein refrains from drinking bottled water
  - Instead, he/she donates 55 Swiss Francs and grants access to safe drinking water to one person in a developing country
- Goal: 38'000 Waterfootprints (currently: 22'000)
- Impact: Avoid plastic waste and reduce emissions




