

## Informal economy: especial relevance for Africa

## African context: "informal is normal"

- Over two thirds of non-agricultural employment (2005-2010)
- Over **one third** of the continent's GDP (2005-2010)
- Generated 90% of new jobs in the last decade in Kenya, and 83% in Nigeria (2016)
- The majority of **microenterprises** are informal (60% in South Africa)
- Informal sector is on the rise in all countries along with economic growth, modernisation and new technologies









## **Examples of solutions emerging from African start-ups**

- Start-ups blending technological knowledge and a deep understating of local needs to provide solutions
  - Improving access to basic healthcare services such as second medical opinions in rural and remote regions
  - Introduction of tablet-style devices that provide access to digital educational materials even in remote and intermittently connected schools
  - Provision of lights in residential areas based in motion-detection technologies
  - Training services for organic farming and technology-enhanced food processing practices to underprivileged girls
  - Possibilities to scale-up reliant on successful partnerships with a broad set of stakeholders



## **Reflections and recommendations**

- Sustainable innovative solutions = youth
- Sustainable innovative solutions = build on existing African productive systems
  - Making the invisible, visible
    - Building capabilities of innovative micro-enterprises and start-ups
    - Innovative businesses that involve and benefit low-income, marginalised and vulnerable people
