

Modalities for 1st time presenters


- Countries presenting a VNR for the 1st time will have 15 minutes for their virtual presentation.

- The 15-minute time allocation includes the use of audio-visual material, including videos.
- MGoS representatives can put a question to each of the countries presenting a VNR after each presentation. The MGoS VNR Task Group will outline the nomination process in further detail.

Modalities for 2nd / 3rd time presenters

- Countries presenting a VNR for the 2nd / 3rd time will have 10 minutes for their virtual presentation in panel format.
- Followed by a similar among of time for questions from other countries and stakeholders.
- The 10 minutes time allocation includes the use of audio-visual material, including videos.
- MGoS representatives can put a question to each of the countries presenting a VNR once the presentations of the panel are complete. The MGoS VNR Task Group will outline the nomination process in further detail.







- Has a Coordination Mechanism- with representatives of all groups to facilitate meaningful participation
- CM may create Tasks Groups for specific activities, they report directly to the CM and coordinate with Co-Chairs

Principles for Stakeholder Involvement 2021

- Bring national issues highlighted by key actors and civil society within
 VNR countries to the HLPF
- All statements are collaboration between different groups, respecting HR and gender equality aspects and considering how structural barriers are approached
- Statements are delivered on behalf of those who are working together on the statement (not the entire MGoS)
- Input to country statements from transversal/cross-cutting and thematic viewpoints as well as interlinkages
- Statements incorporate a broad and diverse range of views from partners in the country

2030 Agenda-Levels of Stakeholder Participation

01

Inform

One-way communication, where governments inform stakeholders of their plans for implementation and review of the 2030 Agenda

02

Consult

Government presents plans and options for implementation and review of the 2030 Agenda, and receives feedback from stakeholders. 03 Involve

Stakeholders are meaningfully engaged with governments in generating plans and options for implementation and review of the 2030 Agenda.

Action plans based on decisions that arise from this input.

04

Collaborate

Governments and stakeholders decide together on the implementation and review of the 2030 Agenda. This is long-term, complex and demanding, requiring resources.

05

Empower

Process for Stakeholder Involvement 2021

- 1. MGoS VNR Task Group is formed to guide the process (May)
- 2. Call for expressions of interest from all stakeholders active in the country via online questionnaire BY 18 JUNE:

https://forms.gle/wQsRSbnERrQ68AGw6

- **3.** Series of webinars in early June:
 - French: 7 June @ 9h 10h EDT (NY);
 - Spanish: 8 June @ 2.30 3.30pm (NY);
 - English: 9 June @ 9am 10am EDT (NY)
- 4. Connect active volunteers from each country and support them to work together as a group/country team (from 18 June)
- 5. Group to draft collaborative statement (300 words) and up to 3 questions (June-July)
- 6. Each group will then decide on one speaker for HLPF (July)

Collaborative Process for Stakeholder Involvement 2021

- Remote participation and collaborative input in drafting MGoS statements for each VNR country is made possible
- Engagement of key actors within VNR countries
- Connecting and engaging in dialogue with CSOs organisations prior to the HLPF (those that are engaged in national implementation processes and VNR preparation)
- Bring national issues highlighted by civil society at the grassroots level to the HLPF
- Statements at the HLPF are delivered by representatives of the national civil society
- Liasing with UN Secretariat on the process
