

Collaboration/Cooperation/Coordination needed But it takes time and effort


So, how to structure in a way that adds value?

Mainstreaming Biodiversity in Sectors

"Biodiversity mainstreaming is the process of embedding biodiversity considerations into **policies, strategies** and **practices** of key **public** and **private** actors that **impact or rely on biodiversity**, so that it is conserved and sustainably used both locally and globally" (GEF STAP Advisory Document 2014)




Description and mapping of areas that meet the EBSA criteria





 - -Regional consultations
 - -Thematic consultations
- Opportunity to learn from the lessons on Aichi Targets and SDGs





LESSONS

Collaboration/coordination requires investment of time and resources, is often part of a long-term process and is based on mutual trust and understanding

Collaboration needs to be structured around issues of

common interest

Regional-scale collaboration/coordination on marine environment, biodiversity and fisheries provides promising avenue to facilitate improved implementation and reporting tracking of global targets
