Excellency,

We look forward to welcoming you to the intergovernmental negotiations on the Post-2015 Development Agenda next week, for which we have already provided you with a draft programme.

Here are some further clarifications.

On Monday 23 March, the session from 10.30 am -1 pm will begin with a presentation from the Chairperson of the UN Statistical Commission on a paper containing preliminary global indicators which we will be circulating to you in the next couple of days.

On the afternoon of Tuesday 24 March, we envisage making time for presentations by individual member States on examples of approaches to implementation of the SDGs at national level.

On the morning of Friday 27 March, we envisage making time for a discussion of themes for the interactive dialogues at the Summit.

On the afternoon of Friday 27 March, following the discussion of the April session and coordination with the Financing for Development process, we are making provision for a possible discussion of related issues such as a technology facilitation mechanism. We envisage the closing session taking place from 5.30 pm - 6.00 pm.
