Collection household waste – only 70 % recieve regular service







Low recycling rates and unadequate treatment





Weak capacity and low awareness






Financial problems

- Only 50 % pay the collection fee
- Enterprises bringing waste to municipal solid waste management facilities not charged





Treatment of municipal waste in Sweden 2009





A long road from the 1960 to 2009

From: Low coverage of collection, backyard burning, dumping, low standards landfills and incineration and low recyclingrates

To: 100 % collection, high recycling, few landfills with high standard and clean and efficient incineration... but a lot more waste








Important changes and instrument used

- 1960 Municipal responsibility for collection of household waste
- 1980 Improved collection of hazardous waste
- 1990 Local waste management planning,
 - Producer responsibility
 - EU-membership

• 2000 – Landfill directive, landfill ban for organic waste,

tax on landfilling

2010 – Prevention of waste





Factors that made it possible

- Clear responsibility for the municipalities
- A good possibility to get financing
- Several measures to support recycling
- Public awareness
- Regional and national cooperation
- Local waste management plans

Five regional workshops

- 50 municipalities, 90 participants

Factors that made it possible


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Elements for a successful project
