





























Educating consumers and expanding green markets within particular cultures can reduce individual impacts and allow economies to produce more goods with fewer inputs. Eliminating ecological shadows, however, will require far more than educating citizens and expanding environmental markets. It will require efforts to prevent environmentally harmful products, with their attendant ecological costs, from being shifted into "emerging" markets as sales of such products in "educated" and "green" markets shrink. It will require tough measures to transform how multinational corporations, trade, international financing, and state policies currently distribute the costs and benefits of globalized consumption.
