Research focusing on different leverage points in the production /consumption cycle





WSSD: 10 year review of progress


- Review of implementation of Rio

- Problem of "implementation gap."



Oslo Declaration on Sustainable Consumption

Oslo, Norway, 12 February 2005


A Call for Action from the Oslo Meeting Participants

The signatories of this Declaration call upon policy makers responsible for the design of future research initiatives to develop action programs on sustainable consumption. Specific initiatives should include:

- **1. Each geographic region** of the world should establish within the next two years a **collaborative research program** focused on sustainable consumption.
- 2. Each geographic region of the world should implement **pilot projects designed to test research findings** and to foster **social experiments** predicated upon novel sustainable consumption systems.
- 3. Countries and regions are encouraged to establish adequate **monitoring and evaluation practices** to assess the effectiveness of their sustainable consumption policies, to enable continuous learning, and to ensure that initiatives are regularly updated.
- 4. The WSSD ten-year framework of programs on sustainable consumption and production should **provide a** platform for all regional research efforts to identify opportunities for translating research into concrete policy initiatives.
- 5. A collaborative program representing regional research institutions and international organizations working on sustainable consumption should be created. To foster the objectives of this Declaration, the participants of the Oslo meeting have proposed to create a **knowledge network for sustainable consumption to develop a common research agenda.**

A global research forum on sustainable production and consumption

- An opportunity for researchers on SCP to assess the "state of the art" of research and knowledge in this field
- To address an audience of research users – decision-makers and practitioners.
- Explore ways to improve the interface between research and action.
