# International Cooperation on Technology Transfer: Time for Action

Organized by the UN-CEB Cluster on Technology Transfer and UN-Energy Supported by UN-DESA and UNIDO

Low-carbon technologies are central to meeting the challenges, and taking advantage of the opportunities, posed by climate change. This UN-coordinated side event will focus on actions and programmes related to clean energy technologies, with a specific emphasis on international cooperation.

In the aftermath of the UNFCCC COP13 in Bali, the UN Chief Executives Board (CEB) declared technology transfer as one of the focus areas of the UN system's work on climate change and assigned the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation (UNIDO) and the Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN-DESA) as co-conveners. This focus area was established to enhance system-wide coherence on climate change-related technology development and transfer and facilitate cooperation among UN system organizations.

While the UNFCCC's Parties combine their efforts to ensure economic growth along low carbon emission paths, the UN system has a major catalytic role to play in supporting and actively fostering their efforts. With its wealth of programmes, tools and instruments for delivery, the UN system provides a broad foundation for inducing and facilitating a transition to a low-carbon economy. UN Energy combines the relevant experience of some 20 UN agencies in the areas of energy efficiency, renewable energy and energy access. It focuses on substantive and collaborative actions in regard to policy development and its implementation and effectively engages non-UN stakeholders.
