

What is UN-Water

UN-Water, established in 2003, is

'... the inter-agency mechanism for follow up of the WSSD water-related decisions and the MDGs concerning water ...'

UN-Water is not another Agency

'...promoting coherence in and coordination of, UN system actions ... complementing and add value to existing programmes and projects ...facilitating synergies and joint efforts, ...enhancing efficiency and avoid overlaps... '

How UN-Water works

- Being a "coordination mechanism" it has a "light" governance structure
- ✓ Governance:

Senior Program Managers in charge of water in 26 UN

entities

- Rotating chair (2 years)
- Permanent Secretariat (UN-DESA)
- Holds biannual meetings
- UN-Water includes also non-UN members (e.g. GWP, WWC, WWF, WaterAid, IUCN)

Scope of UN-Water

Freshwater

- ✓ Surface and groundwater
- ✓ Interface freshwater - seawater
- ✓ Quality, quantity
- Uses (domestic, industry agriculture, ecosystem)
- Development, assessment, monitoring

- ✓ responding to emerging issues/specific demands




